

Guiding Principles



- no extra workload or financial cost for TKKMoH
- programme will be self-sustainable, evolve over time
- based on Te Aho Matua
- kaupapa based programme content
- 3 target groups (tamariki, rangatahi, whānau)
- numbers will always be small (community characteristic)
- prefer delivery in Te Reo Māori whenever possible
- use a range of delivery techniques/styles
- priority on utilisation of local skills/expertise
- will provide training/employment opportunities

Mechanisms for transparency/accountability

- letter of agreement (MOU) between TKKMoH and programme
- sub-committee to manage under TKKMoH umbrella
- separate coding for financial reports
- access to TKKMoH facilities
- separate cheque book monthly report to TKKMoH whānau hui
- clear, up-to-date, relevant policies

Sub-committee structure/positions

- Chairperson, Treasurer, Administrator, Funding Officer, Programme Coordinator
- Job descriptions needed for each position

Workload/Roles

- whānau wānanga/focus groups/ideas/support/tautoko
- sub-committee governance, administration, planning, budgets, funding applications, reporting, management
- programme co-ordinator liaison with tutors, preparation for delivery, eg resources, travel, venue
- tutors delivery

Initial goals/objectives

- 10 participants per session
- begin with Kura Tuatahi after-school programme (1-3 days a week), holiday programme and some wānanga for rangatahi/whānau/pakeke
- not likely to want/need before school programme
